

Alton Open-Air Yuletide Markets



We have had to cancel the annual Yuletide Festival and Christmas Lights switch on this year, but we have re-imagined Christmas and are organising a series of small Yuletide Markets taking place in the Market Square every Saturday from the 28th November for 4 weeks. The Christmas lights and tree will be illuminated throughout the Christmas period.

There will be a different selection of stalls each week offering locally produced food and drink, a variety of art, craft and gifts.

Alongside the commercial stalls there will be local charity and community groups.

On Saturday 12th December the Market will be dedicated to local charity and community stalls, as it will coincide with the popular Hampshire Farmers Market and Lions Craft Market.

We ask that you follow the current government social distancing guidelines at all times to stay safe. Thank you.

Christmas Fun - MarmArt Trail

The MarmArt trail aims to draw visitors to Alton to shop but also to interact, enjoy, learn and play for free. The trail consists of 10 large vinyl window sticker characters placed in shop windows around Alton Town Centre. The trail works by scanning any of the characters QR Codes on a mobile device and then watch the characters come to life on your screens.

Younger children will delight in spotting the cute and colourful characters in shop windows and older children (and grown-ups) can engage by learning more about them. Alton Town Centre

Whilst the national picture for 2020 shows an accelerated decline of High Streets resulting from lockdown, Altonians have helped the town buck this trend and have been incredibly supportive by shopping local over the recent months. With people understandably nervous of larger shopping and retails

centres and an increased number of people walking and cycling into town, helped by the installation of new cycle racks and bike repair stations. footfall has been pretty consistent for many businesses.





The introduction of additional safe seating areas over the summer also proved popular, enabling people to have somewhere to meet, enjoy a takeaway coffee or something to eat in a socially distanced environment and spend longer in the town centre. These have now had waterproof parasols added for the wetter winter months.



The town has largely (with one exception) escaped the dramatic loss of chain shops, but it is the independents who have risen to the challenge, providing safe and welcoming environments for their shoppers and we have even seen new small businesses open. Many supported the Alton In Harmony with Nature photography trail and assisted in offering the Mayor's Charity calendar for sale and a number are taking part in this years MarmART trail and Festive Window competition. So, whilst Christmas has been re-imagined for 2020 there will still be plenty to see, do and shop . Don't forget to look out for our social media spotlight campaign shining a light on local independent retailers to remind everyone to support Alton town centre and keep shopping local this Christmas.

What a difference a year makes; many are wishing 2020 was just a bad dream. Restrictions have taken their toll on the council, but I am just so impressed by the way our staff and my fellow Town Councillors have risen to the challenges in the face of constant changes to government guidance.

Our last public meeting was our Annual Electors meeting on 18th March and I am proud to report that all the meetings in the diary since lockdown have taken place, albeit virtually. The public have also been able to attend all of them. We have also produced a weekly Altonian to keep people updated.

The lockdown has also meant we have been focussing on matters closer to home like the prosperity and vitality of the Town Centre. Regular meetings and consultations have been on-going with EHDC and others about the future of our High Street at the heart of the town.

Planning matters still occupy many meetings and in view of the proposed Government changes to planning we are currently looking to keep ahead of the game by reviewing our Neighbourhood Plan. The development of the former Coors brewery site is the next major planning application to be determined by EHDC.

Our Open Spaces have proved life savers to many as somewhere to walk in the fresh air away from the confines of home. We have recently set up a 'Friends of Kings Pond' working party who will meet monthly to carry out specific tasks at the pond. If you would like to help, please contact the Town Hall.

Concern for our young people will always be a priority. We continue to liaise with our local schools and the College and Alton's 'Kings Arms' facility is almost complete. We opened the new skate park at Jubilee but have put the 'Grand Opening' on hold until next year.

Christmas will be a low key affair, as far as the usual events are concerned, but I like to think, that where we lack events, the gaps will be filled by the Altonian generosity of spirit ensuring those alone and isolated are not forgotten.

the Covid -19 pandemic and as community connector we have centralised information, links and activities that have been of benefit to so many people in the community during these difficult times.




Alton & District Community Resilience Fund

With over £20,000 in donations made to the fund we are extremely grateful to all of the local organisations, businesses and individuals who have so generously helped launch and sustain the fund.
