

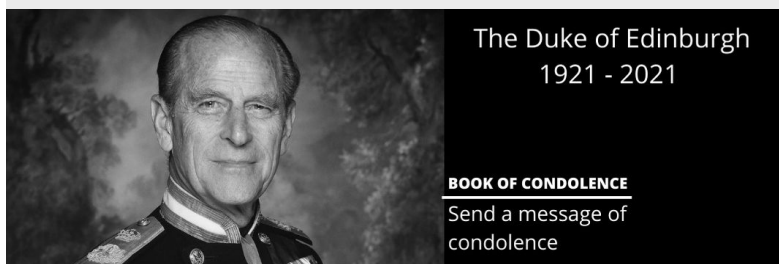

Book of Condolence



To comply with covid restrictions, books of condolence will not be available in public building for people to sign. Anyone wishing to write a message of condolence can now do so in Buckingham Palace's online Book of Condolence www.royal.uk

The Royal Family have also asked for the public to make donations rather than floral tributes. There is no official arrangement for giving donations in memory of The Duke of Edinburgh. However, members of the public who wish to make a donation as a tribute to His Royal Highness are encouraged to give to a charity of their choosing or one of the charities or organisations which The Duke of Edinburgh supported in his public duties.

Alton's Town Mayor, Cllr Graham Titterington, has written to Her Majesty the Queen on behalf of the town offering our condolences on the sad loss of Prince Philip.

The Duke of Edinburgh's funeral will take place on Saturday 17 April at 3pm in Windsor. It will begin with a national minute's silence. The funeral will be broadcasted on national television.

Public Statement 2nd Doses

GPs responsible for covid vaccinations in East Hampshire are encouraging residents to check when they will receive their second dose.

The vaccination clinic at Chineham has given more than 80,000 doses since they opened in December 2020.

They are looking forward to seeing you for your second dose shortly. We have put on the 3rd page a list of dates which shows you when your second dose will be.

Your appointment time will be the same time as your first dose.

Please do not turn up at any other time as we cannot guarantee you a vaccine.

If you have forgotten your time or wish to check your date, please call us on 0333 332 0855 and the team will be happy to help

Similarly if you are over 50, or with underlying health conditions they can get you booked in for a first dose, please call us on 0333 332 0855. Vaccines are helping to keep us all safe.

Speeding Illuminated



Alton Town Council, working alongside Alton Community Speed Watch and Alton & District Residents Association (ADRA) have been deploying vehicle activated Speed Limit Reminder signs across the town since last summer.

Three devices are on constant active duty day and night in fortnightly rotations through 26 approved locations. The signs which are relocated every two weeks across various residential locations, help ensure drivers adhere to local speed limits and keep our roads safe.

The analysis of the data shows that 72% of Alton's motorists may not have noticed the devices as they were already travelling within the speed limit, but, even with traffic volumes lower over the

last 9 months with covid restrictions the SLRs were triggered by motorists 527,934 times! In addition to the visual reminder for motorists traveling above the limit the data collected from the units becomes valuable in being able to target hotspots in conjunction with Alton Community Speedwatch (when operation allows) and liaising with Police for problem spots for enforcement.

A new deployment programme has now been approved for 2021 with some previous deployment locations removed where the evidence shows very little or no evidence of speeding and new roads introduced where there is a perceived problem of excessive speeding.
